Michigan began monitoring schedule II controlled substances in 1998. In January 2003, the program changed to require dispensers to submit dispensing data on schedule II through V controlled substances to MAPS. The start-up costs for MAPS were \$400,000. Currently, expenses are funded with a portion of the controlled substance license fee.
